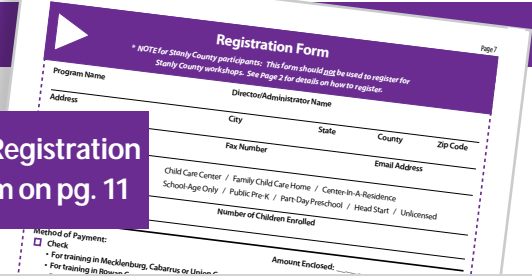

Session Codes

Each training description lists the following information to help you decide if a session is right for you:

AUDIENCE: Indicates if training sessions are intended for staff from:

- Child Care Centers = **C**
- Family Child Care Homes = **F**
- Centers In A Residence = **R**
- All Child Care Programs = **A**

LEVEL: Indicates level of knowledge or information participants can expect to gain by from a training session. When considering a session, participants should determine if it “fits” your current level of professional development. This scale is adapted from the Early Care and Education Career Lattice described in Child Care Resources’ *Reaching Higher* professional development plan.

Administration

Emergency Preparedness and Response*

Are you prepared for an emergency at your program? This session provides strategies for ensuring children's safety during emergencies, and addresses skills and resources needed to inform staff and families in these situations. Cultural Competence in the Classroom

Learn how to communicate with non-English speakers, make classrooms more culturally accessible, and provide adequate supports for families from all cultures.
